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A GROWING CONCERN

ndia is one of the fastest growing economies and correspondingly has immense opportunities to offer to its workforce. However, owing to the wide economic and social disparities, India has failed to appropriate its resources adequately within the social strata. Social development in India remains a challenging task as the country struggles to overcome various social problems despite the economic development.

For instance, as per UNESCO

- India has the highest population of illiterate adults at 287 million
- It has the largest population of children in the world
- The data on mortality rates, juvenile delinquency and literacy rates shows alarming trends

The Government of India has incorporated several measures for social uplifting of the weaker sections of the society by means such as constitutional provisions, national policies and five year plans. However, improper implementation of these measures has reduced their effectiveness in combating the problem.

THAT CAN NO LONGER BE IGNORED...

Reports by UNICEF

Children constitute 39% of India's population, among which:

- 12% are working as child laborers
- Mortality rate among children below the age of 5 61/1000
- Infant mortality rate 47/1000
- 48% of children under the age of 5 have underdeveloped growth
- Total number of orphans 214.52 lakh

Reports by NFHS (National Family Health Survey)

- Increase in child laborers 11.28 million in 1991 to 12.66 million in 2001
- Children engaged in work Rural (12.9%) and Urban (8.6%)
- Child marriages West Bengal (25%), Maharashtra (19%), Andhra Pradesh (15%), Gujarat (13%) and Karnataka (12%)
- Juvenile IPC crimes in 2011 increased by 10.5%

Other Reports

- Out of every 100 children, 19 won't be enrolled in a school
- Of every 100 children who enroll, 70 drop out by the time they reach the secondary level
- Of every 100 children who drop out of school, 66 are girls
- 65% of girls in India are married by the age of 18 and become mothers soon after their marriage

THIS IS WHY WE ARE DOING OUR BIT...

Valmiki Foundation has pursued the cause of community development in and around Hyderabad (India) since 2008, and has been working to tackle social issues at the grassroot level by working in concert with various other NGOs and the State Government of Andhra Pradesh. One of its prime concern deals with the betterment of underprivileged children in an attempt to bring smiles to their innocent faces and leading them out of ill-fated and detrimental social settings, into more socially stable environments.

VALMIKI FOUNDATION

Valmiki Foundation is a CSR initiative of the Valmiki Group, trying to cater to the needs of the downtrodden especially the children living in difficult circumstances. Since its inception, the Foundation has been trying to raise awareness regarding several social issues concerning children. Chief among them have been focused at eradicating child labor, providing healthy meals to the malnourished, providing shelter to orphans and reducing illiteracy. 'Valmiki Hriday' is one such step in this direction – The orphanage started operations on 26th June, 2011 and since then has dedicated itself to the task of providing food, shelter, education and most importantly emotional support to the homeless children

The children are enrolled in our unique, customized schooling system at IUN Schooling. The system is intended to introduce them to Indian value system while still learning about global modernization. This format helps is developing solid reasoning and technical skills among the children. However, mere education does not ensue in overall development of a child. At the orphanage, we aim to provide the young ones a fulfilling childhood. Therefore, they are encouraged to participate in various co-curricular activities such as dance, sports, yoga & spiritual exploration and, outings to historically and culturally significant places.

VALMIKI HRIDAY

V almiki Hriday, the orphanage operated under Vamlmiki Foundation provides underprivileged and orphan children with food, shelter, education and a refined lifestyle.

Children, with their innocent smiles, never fail to remind us of all that is good in a human being. It is with the spirit to keep this uncorrupted virtue of their smile always shining that this orphanage has been set up. More of a care center than an orphanage, we aim to provide assistance of any kind required by the young ones we have accommodated in our premises.

Since its inception, Valmiki Hriday has come to the aid of several

- Orphan children
- Children with single parent
- Children from BPL (Below Poverty Line) families
- Mentally & physically challenged children
- HIV affected children
- Abandoned children

By 2014, we had 30 children staying at the premises and being provided for. Every year there is an attempt to increase the resources in order to provide complete support and care for an even greater number of children.



V almiki Leadership Forum is a subsidiary of Valmiki Foundation. The forum has been established to empower youth in India through various means such as leadership programs, academic and career counseling and youth entrepreneurship promotion.

IUN SCHOOL

UN Schooling is an educational method and philosophy that replaces traditional schooling as a primary means of learning. IUN Scholars learn through their natural life experiences including play, household responsibilities, personal interests and curiosity, internships and work experience, travel, books, elective classes, family, mentors, and social interaction. It encourages exploration of activities initiated by the children themselves, believing that the personal learning is more meaningful, well-understood and therefore useful to the child.

Believing in such an ideology, Valmiki Foundation, with the help of two volunteers - Sumit Garg and Atha Ulla Khan came out with an innovative idea called the IUN Schooling methodology. We have begun implementing this method and the results have been better than our expectations.

Session Format

- Students learn by exploring electronic and electrical devices
- They completely disassemble the device and assemble it back by themselves
- Small batch of 10 students led by an expert instructor to ensure lectures through presentation, video, assessment and other modern teaching aids and methodologies.
- Working device is used for demonstration. Non-working devices are used for practice by students
- Students are given a complete autonomy
- Precautions are taken by the instructor with respect to their safety
- Each learning session lasts two and a half hours

Some of the devices used for experimentation

- Laptops & Desktops
- Mobiles & Tablets
- Pressing Irons, Refrigerators, Washing Machines, Fans, Air Coolers and Water Pumps
- Radios and Calculators
- Solar Panels
- Inventors & UPS

Benefits to Students

- Initiation into self-learning
- They develop a confident attitude towards science and technology
- They discover that these devices are not as complex or mysterious as they seem to be
- Students and teachers can relate to these sessions during regular classes based on school curriculum
- IUN Schooling transforms students into explorers' with hands-on experience







SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

V almiki Foundation supports students in building a successful future, with dedication and passion. The foundation offers aid and support through various means.

One such means is the Valmiki Foundation's 'Scholarship Program' which is reserved for merit students. Applications are accepted from students, parents, schools and NGOs before June 1, every academic year.

The selected students are awarded with Rs. 3000/- (Rupees three thousand) towards their educational expenditure by June 26 every academic year.

Who is eligible for this scholarship?

- Indian nationals
- Orphans, single parents, street children & child laborers
- Students from primary school to post-graduation
- Students from registered orphanages, NGOs, Trusts, government or private schools & individuals
- Academic performance required are an average score of 70% in examinations
- Annual income of the parent should be below Rs. 36,000 per year (In case of single parent.)

Documents to be furnished at the time of application

- Covering letter from respective Orphanage, NGO, Trust or School
- Mark sheet of qualifying examination
- Detailed case study of an applicant
- Address proof (In case of an individual)

AN INTERACTIVE SESSION - RESIDENTS OF SMILES OLD AGE HOME AT MEDCHAL




SKAL INTERNATIONAL ANNUAL CHARITY DAY




G.BHARGAVI CHAKRI

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
